#### Gender equality: what can politicians achieve?

Equal pay for equal work, the right to parental leave and the desirability of job quotas are perennial issues on the gender equality front. However, the current crisis is lending an added urgency to the debate since the economic downturn is affecting women more than men.

The gender pay gap has been only marginally reduced in recent years and, on average, women in the EU still earn 17.5% less than men, even though they make up 60% of new university graduates. Only 12% of business executives in the EU are women and only 3% of chairpersons.

How can gender equality be advanced through legislation, through internal staff policies and communication policy and by promoting gender equality among politicians in parliaments and government? These are among the topics to be explored at a **joint meeting of MEPs**, **national MPs and specialised media in Brussels on Wednesday 3 October**.

Gender issues need to be tackled on many fronts, which is why the meeting brings together members of various political and administrative bodies.

This event takes place at the mid-way point between the International Women's Days for 2012 and 2013, which are always commemorated by a series of events at the Parliament. Journalists will also be able to find out in greater detail what steps the EP itself is taking, at an **introductory press workshop on Tuesday 2 October**, the day before the main event.
