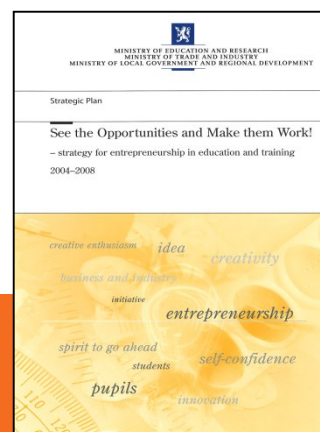
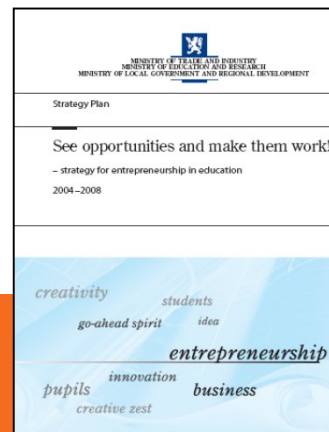

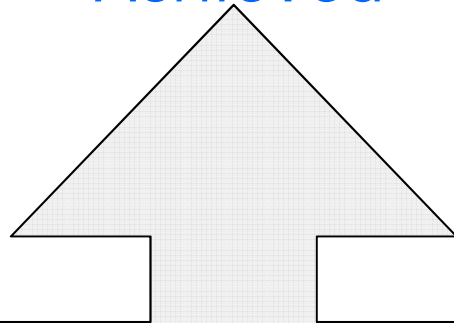
Entrepreneurship in Education 2004 – 2006 – 2009 → 2014

- Three Ministries responsible for the national Entrepreneurship policy
 - The Ministry for Education and Research
 - The Ministry for Trade and Industry
 - The Ministry for Local Government and Regional Development
- A national Strategy from primary school to College and University level
- 2004 – Strategy Plan 1 (*See the opportunities and make them work*)
- 2006 – Revision, Strategy Plan 2
(New national Knowledge Promotion Reform and subject curricula, Grade 1-13)
- 2008 – Evaluation
- 2009 – Action Plan in the period up to 2014



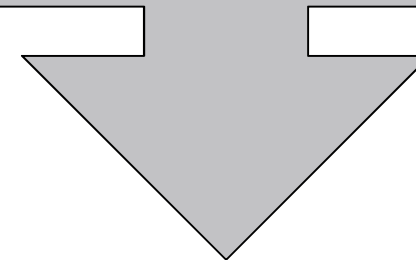
Aim achievement 2004 - 2010

Achieved



- Increased cooperation between educational institutions, business community and local- as well as national public sector
- Competence upgrading – teachers and principals in primary and secondary schools
- Teacher Training institutions cross the country offer entrepreneurship courses/studies
- Junior Achievement-Young Enterprise – Government support in the context of following-up the national Strategy

- Lecturers in Teacher Colleges have not strengthened their competence
- Regional differences with regard to the extent of activities
- Regional differences to which extent the strategy is grounded by the school owners
- Textbooks/materials



Not Achieved

The FUTURE - improvement

- Strengthen the entrepreneurship competence of lectures and school managers
- Develop and disseminate textbooks and instruction manuals
- Research - widen the knowledge-base about entrepreneurship in education
- Transnational collaboration concerning entrepreneurship in education
- The Oslo Agenda – a rich menu of proposals (51 % of the proposed actions are honoured in the Norwegian policy)
