Episode

Although Hon. PARK passed the 22nd Bar Examination in 1980, he was left out of the appointment to the bench as judge on the ground that he had disabilities. As such, Hon. PARK appealed to the media on unjust treatment of the judiciary branch, resulting in garnering support of people from all walks of life including social leaders and starting on his legal career as judge of Daegu Administrative Court in 1983. After having served as judge in Daegu and Masan Administrative Court, Hon. PARK opened up his own practice as lawyer in Daegu in 1988.

While he was on the bench, there was a policeman who brought his son to most of Hon. PARK's trials. The policeman's son has a disability with his leg, but the policeman instilled confidence and courage into his son by showing him Hon. PARK on the bench as role model.

This episode is widely known among the legal circle as well as many scholars who stress the importance of having role models.
