Mirko Stefanovic

Mirko Stefanovic was born on April 18, 1952 in Novi Sad. He graduated in 1974 with a Law Degree from the University of Novi Sad.

Mirko Stefanovic worked in a Law Office in Novi Sad for two years, before joining the Matica Srpska Gallery in Novi Sad as a Secretary in 1976. In 1979 he joined the Executive Council of the Autonomous Province of Vojvodina as an Adviser and Assistant Secretary General of the Council, and thereafter Undersecretary in the Council and Advisor to the President of the Executive Council.

In 1986 he joined the Federal Secretariat for Foreign Affairs in Belgrade. He became the Consul at the Embassy of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia in Baghdad, Iraq, thereafter his mandate he returned to Belgrade for a year in the Directorate for Middle East and Africa. In 1992 Mr. Stefanovic was the Charge d'Affaires in the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia in Tel Aviv, until 1997 when he was appointed Ambassador of FR Yugoslavia to Israel.

After his mandate as an Ambassador in Israel in 2001, he returned to Yugoslavia and joined the private business. In 2007 he returned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Serbia as the Secretary General.

In 2009 Mr. Stefanovic was appointed State Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In 2011 he was appointed as the Ambassador of the Republic of Serbia to the Republic of Portugal.

Mr. Stefanovic speaks English and German, is married and has two children.
