






Rate newly reported HIV diagnoses










Proportion of HIV diagnoses, by route of transmission, 2013, EU/EEA






HIV infections diagnosed, **EU/EEA**

2004-2013, transmission mode and origin







Rate newly reported HIV diagnoses










HIV infections diagnosed, non-EU/EEA




2004-2013, transmission route



Global international AIDS assistance




- Although international AIDS assistance has plateaued since 2008, it still remains high
- Red line indicates EU contributions since 2008 (from 40% to 28%)

2013 contributions to the international AIDS response as a proportion of GDP (USD)




Political leadership in the EU is strong



- HIV/AIDS is high on the EU political agenda
- HIV prevention funding is prioritised towards key populations
- Most EU Governments and civil society agree that policies and laws do not present major barriers to HIV prevention, care and treatment
- Most governments and civil society agree that EU countries are providing ART coverage at scale for key populations




Number of people living with HIV receiving treatment

AIDS related deaths


EU/EEA, 2004-2013






Average ART cost per patient and year 2013





Coverage of harm reduction for people who inject drugs, PWID, 2013






